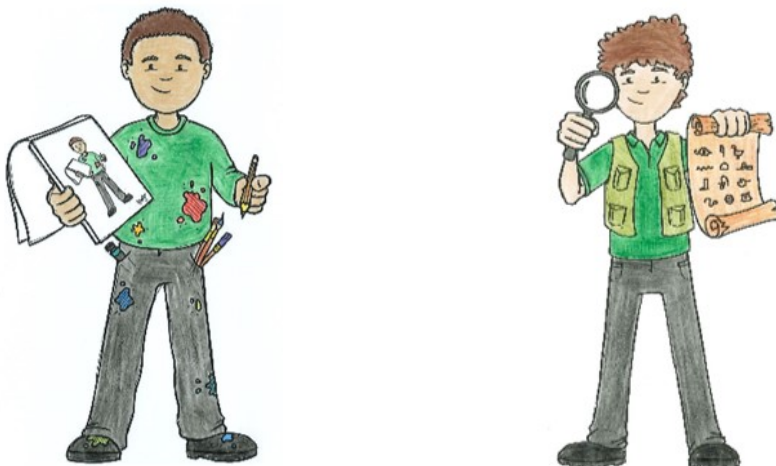


Our Enquiry Question:

In this enquiry we will be **artists and historians**, as well as many other states of being.

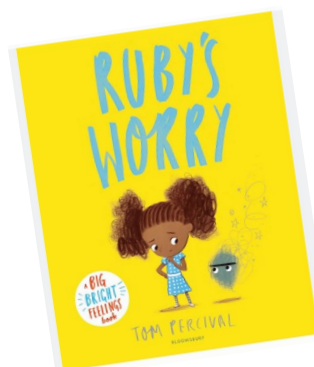


As artists, we will look at the features of our face and begin the process of creating our own self portraits. We will focus initially on drawing our faces, before moving on to use other media. We will finish by creating a final portrait, which will be displayed in our school hall!

As historians, we will look back at how we have changed since we were babies. We will look at pictures of ourselves when we were younger and talk about how each child has had different experiences up until now.

The challenge:

To create a 'What makes me special?' museum exhibit. The children will be able to tell each other about all of the different things that make them unique.
