Maths

This term, we will be continuing with our daily Mini Maths arithmetic sessions as well as our times table tests each Friday. Times table knowledge is vital this year, as it supports so many areas of the maths curriculum.

Enquiry—How are shadows significant in art?

We will become Scientists and Artists as we explore the link between light and shadow, and how artists use this within their art.

We will begin the term by exploring shadows themselves, including learning how light travels through experimenting with light sources and equipment. We will also be discovering why shadows are the same size as the object that casts them and delving into how it is that we are able to see objects by (briefly!) learning about how our eyes and brain work together to produce images. We will then move onto the artist element by exploring the work of a handful of artists and will use their work as inspiration for our own creations.
